I. WELCOME:

Dr. Spencer welcomed everyone to the meeting, and a round of self-introductions was made.

II. MEETING OBJECTIVE FOCUS:

Strategic planning around suicide prevention.

III. DR. SPENCER'S INTRODUCTION AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- We will not meet in November. Our next meeting will be in December.
- The next few meetings' focus will cover a wide range of health topics such as: suicides, over-utilization of the ER by mental health patients and substance abuse.
- We plan for these topics in order to support county coalitions addressing health in the
 community, etc. However, our role could be changing. DHMH is putting forth grant
 proposals for future funding to possibly expand our role to implementation. Dr. Spencer
 will keep the coalition informed of any updates in this area.
- Dr. Spencer is presenting tonight, October 21st at the hospital in Kent County at 7pm during the combined Cancer Support Group's meeting.
- Dr. Spencer reviewed pertinent data from last meeting's PPT presentation via a handout that was distributed with selected slides.
- We are working on a planning strategy to put us in a ready position if funds become available to implement. This way we will already have backing from the entire region.

V. LINDA WALLS- RESULTS ACCOUNTABILITY

In the past 11 years, there have been 25 suicides in the transitional age group (age 16-25) on the Mid-Shore. Of those, 23 were males, 2 were females- all white. Firearm use in suicides is increasing nationally; on the Mid-Shore the percentage is about 54%.

Kids Count Data- for lack of social support and community connectedness, we ranked 20th. Community connectedness was very low, at 17-19% (feeling valued in the community). These numbers did not vary between rural and urban youth.

We are using results accountability to plan strategies for suicide prevention. We started this process last month. The process uses a series of questions that focus on common questions, common language and common outcomes to achieve the overarching goal you are striving for.

- Desired Result- EX: Suicide Prevention
- Headline Indicators- 1-3 data trends that can be tracked to show results over time.
- What's the story behind the data? EX: The PowerPoint presentation shared by Dr. Spencer.
- Is there some data that would indicate if we made a difference?
 - Why is it this age group?
 - Why the increase?
 - Demographics?
- Who are the partners with a role to play?
- What works to achieve the results? Achieved by brainstorming ideas and using best practices/evidence-based strategies.
- Pick 2-5 things to turn into a list for overarching strategies
 - When to act on those strategies?
 - Who will do it?
- Grant application, local action team, needs assessment, etc.
- 3 results: listed at top of planning page handout
 - Integrated system of care where prevention, screening, and intervention for behavioral health are common practices across the lifespan
 - Significant reduction (10%) in behavioral health visits to the Emergency Department
 - View behavioral health as essential to overall health

Today focusing on suicide-People need to become more comfortable talking about these issues to reduce stigma.

- Motor vehicle accident as a method
- Increased use of psychotic drugs as a connection to suicide
